Three armed robbers killed in Delta

Three suspected
armed robbers
were yesterday,
shot dead by a
military patrol team along
the busy Airport Road in
Warri, Delta State.

It was gathered that the
felled bandits met their wa-
terloo as they attempted to
snatch a bag containing un-
specified amount from the
owner.

Sources said that the rob-
bers had waylaid the unsus-
pecting man who had made
withdrawals from a bank.

Investigation revealed
that the man vehemently
resisted the robbers attempt
to snatch the bag. Nemesis
caught up with the gang
when the patrol team came
to the scene and gunned
down three of the bandits
while two escaped with bul-
let wounds.

A witness told Daily Sun
that the bandits parked their
vehicle at the bank prem-
ises, pretending to be cus-
tomers and even discussed
freely with some traders sell-
ing their wares at the nearby
stores.

"We were surprised see-
ing the boys, who possibly
were in their twenties, strug-
gling with the man that came
out of the bank and, as God
would have it, a military pa-
trol team emerged from no-
where and killed three of the
robbers in a gun exchange",
said the witness who did not
want her name in print.

According to feelers from
various quarters in the oil
city, bandits now operate in
buses as part of their several
strategies to beat law en-
forcement agents. It was also
gathered that some hood-
lums who operate in buses
drug their passengers and
take them to unknown desti-
nation to rob them.
