2 shot dead over leadership tussle in Delta

t least, two persons were shot
dead yesterday in
a renewed leadership tussle, Ekpan in
Uvwie Local Government
Area of Delta State.

Daily Sun gathered that the incident occurred at about 5.30pm at the Bunkering Junction near the everbusy NPA Expressway.

A source in the community told Daily Sun that trouble started when the community chairman whose tenure had allegedly expired refused to vacate his position. In the ensuing fight between youths loyal to both factions, one of the youths described as the son of a prominent chief in the area, rushed home for a gun and allegedly shot at one of the youths, identified as Samuel, in the chest and another unidentified person.

Following the tension induced by the incident, men of the Joint Task Force had been drafted to the community to restore peace.

It was gathered that the other faction had threatened to burn down every house belonging to the suspect's family.

Already, residents of the area, it was learnt, were deserting their homes due to the threat to attack the area.

Efforts to contact the divisional police officer (DPO) in-charge of the area failed as calls placed to his telephone line were not picked. Also, the state Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), DSP Celestina Kalu, said she had not been briefed on the incident.
