Again, truck kills 2 in Cross River

Ugep community in Cross River Central District as a truck crushed two persons at the weekend.

Those who died in the accident were a motorcyclist and his female passenger.

Checks revealed that this was the third time trucks killed passers-by in that axis of Ugep/Ikom federal highway in

the last four months.

It was gathered that the accident, which occurred in the wee hours of the day, involved a trailer and a motorcycle.

According to eyewitness account, the trailer was coming from Ikom and suddenly veered off and rammed into the motorcycle, crushing the rider and his female passenger.

The motorcyclist was said to have died on the spot while the passenger, who was rushed to a nearby hospital at Ugep, later gave up the ghost.

The truck driver was said to have fled the scene of the accident.

The witness said the trailer driver lost control while attempting to avoid a bad portion of the road, and veered off its lane, hitting the motorcyclist and the passenger.

As at the time of this report, village sources told Daily Sun that the mangled body of the motorcyclist, simply identified as Egezem, and the corpse of

the passenger, Ms. Ugomnnaya, had been buried at Ebijakara community in Abi Local Government Area of the state.

One of the bereaved family members, Chief Emmanuel Egbe, who spoke with *Daily Sun* shortly after the accident, confirmed the death of his brother.

He urged the Federal Road Safety Commission (FRSC) and the police to prosecute the truck driver.
