Grandmother, grandson die in late night inferno

Tragedy struck in Ado Ekiti yesterday morning at about 12 midnight when a grandmother, simply identified as Mrs. Omoniyi, and her six-year-old grandson, Marvelous, got burnt to death in in fire incident that also consumed valuable items in a two-bedroom apart-

ment in Fajuyi Housing Estate on Ilawe Road in Ado-Ekiti, Ekiti State.

Mrs. Omoniyi, in her late 60s, was said to be a nurse with the Ekiti State Ministry of Health before she retired, a couple of years ago. Until her death, she was living with her son, Marvelous' father, who incidentally travelled on the evening of August 22, a day before the tragedy.

A neighbour, who did

not want his name in print told Daily Sun yesterday: "It was about 11.30 on Friday night when my little boy who had gone to the toilet raised the alarm that something was happening in Mama Omoniyi's place. Then, I peeped through my window and saw Mama's neighbour, who lives in Block 2, Flat 10 running around Mama's apartment and shouting Mama! Mama! Mama!"
