Mother of 2 electrocuted in Bayelsa

Tragedy struck in Amarata, Yenagoa the Bayelsa State Capital yesterday when a housewife was electrocuted while cleaning her standing fan.

The deceased identified as Mrs Anne Alakiri was

said to have died instantly following the electric shock.

According to eyewitness account, the mother of two was found dead with the standing fan on her body when neighbours got into the house.

Investigations revealed that she was in her room, which was flooded following a downpour, the previous day, cleaning the

standing fan but unaware that live current had been passed to the metal blades.

A neighbour described her death as a tragedy for the neighbourhood and her church located at Ovom.

"The woman was a gentle catholic woman. She just got married three years ago. She will be missed a lot by the Catholic members of Ovom," the neighbour said.
