2 tri-cycle riders killed in Warri, another wounded

Two commercial tri-cycle operators were shot dead yesterday, in Warri, Delta State by armed bandits who have laid siege to the oil city in recent times.

Daily Sun gathered that the victims met their untimely death in the early hours of yesterday, at the notorious Warri garage and Bazunu axis of the oil city. The first victim, whose name could not be ascertained at press time, was said to have struggled with the hoodlums at about 5a.m. and apparently angered by his courage, the

hoodlums shot him at close range. The source told Daily Sun that the victim, simply addressed as "Mallam," was shot in the stomach, forcing his entire intestine to gush out.

Some passengers, who saw the gory sight, ran back to their houses as they could hardly look at the remains of the victim. A similar incident occurred few moments later, at Bazunu Street, where another tri-cycle rider was shot in the head. The victim, who was reportedly flagged down by three boys was dragged out of the tri-cycle and given the beating of his life before his head was shattered with bullets.
