2 party supporters arraigned for murder in Kano

Two party supporters in Kano, Alhaji Salihu Yunusa and Alhaji Yunusa Ismaila, have been remanded in prison by a Kano Chief Magistrate Court following their alleged roles in the killing of a resident of Rano local government area, Alhaji Nazifi Barau.

The deceased was killed during a confrontation involving supporters of the two leading parties, APC and PDP who fought over the removal of a flag belonging to one of the parties in the state.

The prosecution led by Inspector Shaibu Musa, told the court that the accused persons were arraigned on a three count charge of joint act, inciting public disturbance and culpable homicide, adding that the offences were contrary to the pro-

vision of the Penal Code Law.

He held that the accused persons, who were both residents of Taure village in Rano LGA, were apprehended for causing the death of the deceased.

According to the prosecution, the accused persons and the deceased were engaged in an argument over the dismantling of a flag belonging to a political party, when the former struck Barau with an object which caused his death.

Inspector Shaibu further affirmed that the deceased died at the scene of the disagreement, noting that one Saleh Abdullahi a resident of the village lodged the complaint at the police station.

The accused persons denied the charge, while the Chief Magistrate, Hajija Mariam Sabo ordered that they be remanded in prison custody, and adjourned the case to March 31st for mention.
