
without much sweat. He taught me how to use razor blade to tear window net and collect phones from victims' houses. It was later that we started using gun to rob people. I participated in six armed robbery with David. We used to take off from Ikorodu to Egbeda around midnight each day we wanted to operate.

"I have also gone to jail. I was arrested and sent to prison but, my sisters and friends perfected my bail and I got my freedom and relocated to Okene, Kogi State. It was one Alhaji, a notorious receiver based in Agege, Lagos that directed me to Okene.

"When I came back from the prison. I was given N1.2million which was part of the money we got from the house of a politician who we robbed after we tore his door net. I knew Akeem was a fake native doctor and we worked together to extort money from victims. I got N5,000 from the first bulletproof charm he did for one victim."

week following brutal attacks by suspected armed bandits in Delta State.

Crime Watch Today gathered that the bloody incidents which occurred at various locations within the Warri metropolis have been described by eyewitnesses as deadly, wicked and merciless.

The first incident, which occurred at about 7pm at the notorious Warri garage, was pathetic and gruesome.

The victim, a jobless young graduate, who was returning from where he was doing private home teaching met his untimely death at the garage.

The victim, whose name could not be immediately ascertained, was accosted by some youths suspected to be bandits, who demanded for the bag the young man of about 26 was carrying.

All entreaties and explanations made by the victim were ignored as the hoodlums brought out a knife and stabbed him several times.

The bandits, having searched the bag, found out that it contained materials he used for lesson which include a laptop and N200.

The victim's letter of employment came hours after his death.

Similarly, a middle-aged man lost his life at the Old Leventis junction while attempting to pursue the hoodlums who snatched his car.
