## Benin school discovers grave in classroom

**A** suspected grave found in one of the classrooms of Iguo-dala Primary School in Uhunduhun community, Oredo Local Government Area of Edo State, yesterday caused a stir in the school.

It was gathered that one of the teachers and some pupils discovered the grave with stains of blood on Monday, shortly after the morning assembly.

They were said to have raised the alarm and drew the attention of the acting head mistress of the school, who quickly ordered the evacuation of the pupils from Primary 1A.

The Head Mistress, Mrs. Georginia Ilongwo, was said to have alerted officers from the Esigie Police Division.

She described the incident as a shocking discovery that had not been witnessed before in the school, adding that many parents had prevented their children from going to school

yesterday (Tuesday) due to the fear of contracting infection.

At the time Daily Sun visited the scene, a pair of shorts and a T-shirt were seen on the floor of the classroom.

Policemen from the Esigie Police Division were also at the scene, some of whom were said to have kept watch from Monday night until some cemetery staff from the local government council carried out an evacuation at about 11.40am yesterday.
