

Police rescue abducted Polytechnic registrar

• Kill 4 kidnap suspects

THE abducted Registrar of the Rivers State-owned Ken Saro-Wiwa Polytechnic, Bori, Mrs. Lillian Davies, has regained freedom.

Mrs. Davies was rescued yesterday, at about 3:30pm by a special tactical outfit

set up by the state Commissioner of Police to tackle the menace of kidnapping in the state.

She was kidnapped on November 17, 2015 by armed men while on transit along Bori-Yaghe road, in Gokana Local Government Area of the state.

State Police Public Rela-

tions Officer (PPRO), Ahmad Muhammad, while confirming her release, said the victim was rescued in a bush around Kaani in Khana Local Government Area.

Muhammad, a Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP), disclosed that four of the kidnap suspects were killed during a gun duel that ensued when operatives moved to rescue the victim.

He said: "The rescue team

during the operation, has a fierce gun duel with the kidnappers resulting in the death of four."

Items recovered from the suspects include one AK47 rifle, a locally made pistol, a magazine, 25 rounds of 7.62 live ammunition and five cartridges.

The state command warned persons indulging in criminal activities to relocate from the State.
