## Lagos judiciary moves against touts

**THE** Lagos State judiciary has launched a major offensive against touts who operate within the vicinity of the Ikeja and Lagos divisions of the courts.

According to *Daily Sun* investigation, the clampdown on touts, followed complain from foreign diplomats who visited the Chief Judge of the state, Justice Funmilayo Atilade recently, in her office at Ikeja.

It was gathered that the diplomats during a courtesy visit had complained about the prevalence of fake affidavits issued to unsuspecting members of the public by the touts.

Apart from affidavit, sources in the court, disclosed that vital documents such as land certificate, marriage certificate bail bond, certificate of occupancy among others are forged by crooks who operate as touts within the court premises.

The Chief was said to have been visibly worried about the concerned expressed by the diplomats and promised that, henceforth, any of the touts caught will face the wrath of the law.

As a result, security has been beefed up around the court. Some of the touts caught, it was gathered, have been made to face summary trial.

"We don't waste time on their case, as soon as they are caught, the police van would come and take them to the station where their charge would be prepared. Immediately, they are taken to the court where they are given quick and fair trial.

"Already, some are in Kirikiri prison. They are giving the country and our system a bad image. The Chief Judge has issued directives and we must carry it out to the later. Any one of them caught within 500 meter to the court premises will be arrested and prosecuted. It was as simple as that," a top security officer disclosed to *Daily Sun* on Friday.

When *Daily Sun* moved around the court, the touts who usually solicited for affidavits and stamp duties have disappeared. However, it was observed that pockets of touts still operate around the Lagos State University Teaching Hospital, Ikeja by the roadside.
