

# Cultists kill 4, behead victim in Rivers

**GUNMEN** suspected to be cultists have killed four persons in a cult clash that erupted in two communities in Ikwerre and Obio/Akpor local government areas of Rivers State.

Trouble started when the killers, on Sunday, murdered a notorious cultist in Rumuekini community, in Obio/Akpor LGA. The body of the suspected cultist, according to community sources, was abandoned in a drainage in Rumuekini, while his severed head was displayed along the East-West Road area of Rumuosi.

Also, on Sunday, suspected cultists killed three persons in Omurele community in Ikwerre

Local Government Area of the state.

*Daily Sun* gathered that the armed youths stormed the community at night and eliminated four persons identified as Bobo

(a.k.a Banigo), Okechukwu Enyinda, Scatter and Amadi, popularly called Too Much Money.

State Police Public Relations Officer, Deputy Superinten-

dent of Police Nnamdi Omoni, did not reply text messages sent to him for confirmation of the killings, at the time of filing this report.

## Cocaine trafficking: Lagos socialite reports to NDLEA

**LAGOS** socialite, who was implicated in a case of unlawful exportation of 1.595kg of cocaine to Saudi Arabia in February 2017 and recently declared wanted by the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA), has reported at the Murtala Muhammed International Airport (MMIA) command, Lagos.

The agency had also secured an interim for-

feiture order on several assets worth billions of naira traced to her.

The suspect reported at the NDLEA office at the weekend, in response to the manhunt organised for her in relation to the investigation of someone who was caught with cocaine on

her way to Saudi Arabia. Subsequently, a team of investigators traced her to her Lagos residence, but she was not at home. The suspect, for several months, ignored invitations from the agency requesting her to clear herself in an ongoing cocaine investigation.

The agency was working for a final forfeiture order on the landed property worth several billions of naira traced to her in Lagos, Ogun and Ogun states. The assets include plots of land and buildings in strategic locations.
