2 die in renewed Ugborodo crisis

TWO persons yesterday died during a renewed crisis in Ugborodo community, Warri South West Local Government Area of Delta State.

It was gathered that the passenger boat of the victims, one Benson Okoturo and Samuel Mayomi, was reportedly attacked by gunmen.

Okoturo, a member of the Interim Management Committee (IMC) reportedly collapsed and died from shock of sporadic gunshots while Mayomi allegedly drowned among other passengers after their boat was rammed into by another boat said to be conveying some armed youths (suspected to opposing Ugborodo youths) who were on a deadly mission.

Five of the passengers, who were reported to have been abducted and tortured for several hours by the gunmen after their boat capsized due to the apprehension of the sporadic gun shots, were later released to the naval personnel who later showed up at the scene of the incident.

Although there was no official confirmation on the incident as at the time of filing this report yesterday as the Delta State Commissioner of Police, Ibrahim Zanna, could not be reached but, the Commander, NNS Delta, Commodore Ibrahim Dewu, disclosed that his men were on top of the situation.
