4 die in Enugu auto crash, 4 injured in gas explosion

THE Enugu State Sector Command of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC) has confirmed the death of four people in a ghastly auto crash that occurred along Enugu - Abakaliki road yesterday.

The sector commander, Mr. Ogbonnaya Kalu, who confirmed the

incident to our reporter on telephone, said the accident occurred around 6am when a Toyota Senna collided with a tipper truck.

While he described the incident as unfortunate, he attributed the accident to **dangerous overtaking.** He warned motorists not to be in hurry while on steering, especially at this festive period. He reminded

them that life has no duplicate.

Kalu said that the bodies had been deposited at the Annunciation Specialists Hospital, Emene, Enugu.

Meanwhile, four people were said to have been seriously injured in a cafeteria located in GRA, Enugu when a gas cylinder exploded.

Confirming the incident, the

state Police Public Relations Officer, Mr Ebere Amaraizu, said the command has commenced investigations into incident. He said incident occurred on Wednesday at about 2:45hrs at one of the popular cafeteria known as Mama Onyinye Restaurant located within GRA axis of the state.
