Family petitions IGP over son's murder

FAMILY of Waidi Obidairo, who was murdered recently in Agodo village, in Ewekoro Local Government Area of Ogun State, have cried to the Acting Inspector-General of Police, Muhammed Adamu, to bring the killers

of their son to justice.

The deceased, a 45-year-old father of six, was allegedly hacked by his killers on December 4, 2018, allegedly over kingship tussles. According a family member: "On December 4, 2018, a gang of armed hoodlums, led by Ayo, attacked Waidi and others, who had gone to Agodo, his hometown, to prepare for a family ceremony slated for December 7, 2018.

"They were attacked with machetes and other weapons. Waidi, who was their target, was butchered to death and his body was recovered by men of Sango-Ota Area Command, led by Adegoke Fayoade. We know those who killed our brother because others who survived the attack gave us graphic descriptions of how he was hacked and vivid description on those

who carried out the attack."

The family has called on the IGP to wade into the matter and bring the killers of Waidi to justice.

They said: "Please help us do justice on this issue, as justice delayed is justice denied. We know those who killed our brother and the reason they killed him."
