According to him, the gunmen later destroyed property worth millions of naira belonging to Alhaji Abubakar Maigandus in the village before abducting sev-

en other victims.

He explained that the police killed one of the attackers, adding that preliminary in the entire community as findings indicate that the people scrambled for their attack was a reprisal one as a result of a long standing communal clash.
