The PPRO said: "The Commissioner of Police, Katsina State Command, has deployed a Deputy Commis-sioner of Police in charge of operations, with additional units of PMF personnel to the area to beef up security and restore confidence in the affected communities.

Medical Council indicts 3 doctors over Peju Ugboma's death

Practitioners Council of Ni-geria (MDCN) has found a prima facie case of profession-al misconduct against three doctors of Premier Specialist
Hospital doctors that caused
the death of celebrity chef,
Mrs Adepeju Ugboma.

The three doctors indicted

have been referred to the disciplinary committee of the MDCN for appropriate actions. They are Doctors.
Akiseku Adeniyi Kazeem,
Kelechi Kingsley Renner and
Motunrayo Amadu of Premier Specialist Hospital. The indictment was the outcome of an investigative panel set up by the Council to consider a petition by Mr Ijoma Ugboma, the husband of the deceased.

The panel reached the decision at its just-concluded 10th session, which was held on October 28, 2021.

Olisa Agbakoba Legal (OAL), lead counsel to the Ugboma family, represented the petitioner at the panel.

OAL also requested a coroner's inquest into the death of Mrs Ugboma, to investigate her family's allegations of medical negligence against Premier Specialist Medical Centre. The inquest is ongoing at the Magistrate Court Ogba, Lagos.
