Bandits murder 11 in Katsina

THE Katsina State police command has confirmed the killing of 11 residents of

Katoge and Yanturaku quarters in Batsari Local Government Area, on Tuesday night.

A press statement by the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Gambo Isah, said that a total of 13 others

were also injured during the incident and that the attackers were armed with AK 47 rifles.

The PPRO said: "The Commissioner of Police, Katsina State Command, has deployed a Deputy Commissioner of Police in charge of operations, with additional units of PMF personnel to the area to beef up security and restore confidence in the affected communities."

Batsari is among the 17 out of the 34 local government areas designated as front line areas where bandits operate regularly.

The state government had taken a number of measures in recent times, including closure of certain highways, restriction of telecommunication networks and ban on operations of motorcyclists, among others, to curtail activities of hoodlums.

Hoodlums stab woman to death in Ondo

A middle aged woman identified as Mrs Yemi Ajayi has been stabbed to death by unknown persons in Akure, the Ondo State capital.

③ Her killing came three years after her daughter, Seun, was also killed gruesomely.

It was learnt that security agencies have not been able to fish out her killer.

② Mrs. Ajayi, it was learnt, was killed in the wee hours of Tuesday at her residence located at the Abusoro area of Akure.

Daily Sun gathered that the woman was stabbed five times on her stomach.

A source, who preferred

not to be mentioned, said the woman's daughter alerted neighbours when she saw her mother in her pool of blood.

The source said: "The young girl narrated to people that when she woke up, she was looking for her mother, so that they could pray together; unfortunately, she didn't see her."

"She went on searching until she found her mother lying lifeless, as the assailants packed some clothes in the wardrobe and used it to cover her body."

Medical Council indicts 3 doctors over Peju Ugboma's death

④ **THE** Medical and Dental Practitioners Council of Nigeria (MDCN) has found a prima facie case of professional misconduct against three doctors of Premier Specialist Hospital doctors that caused the death of celebrity chef, Mrs Adepeju Ugboma.

The three doctors indicted have been referred to the disciplinary committee of the MDCN for appropriate actions. They are Doctors Akiseku Adeniyi Kazeem, Kelechi Kingsley Renner and Motunrayo Amadu of Premier Specialist Hospital. The indictment was the outcome of an investigative panel set up by the Council to consider a petition by Mr Ijoma Ugboma, the husband of the deceased.

The panel reached the decision at its just-concluded 10th session, which was held on October 28, 2021.

Olisa Agbakoba Legal (OAL), lead counsel to the Ugboma family, represented the petitioner at the panel.

OAL also requested a coroner's inquest into the death of Mrs Ugboma, to investigate her family's allegations of medical negligence against Premier Specialist Medical Centre. The inquest is ongoing at the Magistrate Court Ogba, Lagos.
