Gunmen kill 4 in Plateau

herdsmen on Saturday evening killed three residents of Lo-Bwong of Lo-Tang and one other person at a mining site in Dong community, Jos North Local Government Area of Plateau State.

The attackees also inflicted gunshots injuries on a women who is receiving medical attention at an undisclosed hospital in the state.

Plateau State Police Public-Relations-Officer (PPRO), ASP Ubah Gabriel Ogaba, said four persons were killed.

He said the police had commenced investigation into the killings with a view to bringing the perpetrators to book.

He said: "Four people were killed on Saturday during mining in Dong community in Jos North. Investigation has commenced to identify and arrest those who launched the attack."

He urged residents of the community to remain calm and law abiding as the police were working to fish out the suspects.

Chairman Arewa Consultative Forum (ACF), Plateau state, Henry Jadike, who condemned the dastardly act called on security agencies to arrest the perpetrators ans bring them to book.

He expressed his sincere condolences to the bereaved families and urged them to take solace in God. Member representing Jos South/Jos East Federal Constituency in the House of Representatives, Mr Dachung Musa Bagos described the killing as inhumane and callous.

Bagos, who urged security agencies to fish out the perpetrators noted that three of the deceased were members of Lo-Bwong family at Hwolshe in Jos South LGA of the state.

Burning of police barracks over killing of rider: Kogi gov orders investigation

Bello, has directed immediate and full investigation into the killing of a motorcycle rider and the burning of the old Police Barracks in Kabba town, Kabba Bunu Local Government Area of the state.

There was pandemonium in Kabba on Saturday as angry youths stormed the streets following the alleged killing of a young motorcycle rider by a policeman, leading to the burning of the police barracks.

Court to hear Ekiti's application seeking vacation of garnishee order on accounts

JUSTICE Yellin Bogoro of the Federal High Court, Lagos, will on February 4, 2022, hear an application filed by Ekiti State Government praying the court to vacate a garnishee order nisi on its commercial bank accounts.

Justice Bogoro had granted the order in a suit filed by some local government councillors who claimed that they were illegally sacked in November 2010.

The applicant, Mr. Oladimeji Olugbenga Adewumi, had on behalf of himself and other democratically elected

councillors sued Ekiti State government as judgment creditors.

Joined as defendants in the suit are: the Ekiti State government, the Attorney-General of Ekiti State, as well as some commercial banks in Nigeria.
