















Sit-at-home: Blood flows in S'East

THE sit-at-home order issued by the Simon Ekpa faction of IPOB turned bloody last Friday across Imo and in Enugu states as gunmen wrecked havoc at various locations in Imo and Enugu states.

Sunday Sun learnt that no fewer than three policemen were killed, alongside a pregnant woman and eight others A police van, market, shops and goods were also burnt in the process.

It was learnt that some police officers were allegedly killed in a shootout with the gunmen, while the police neutralised many of the bandits, forcing the survivors among them to flee with bullet injuries.
