

5 killed, others injured as rival cult groups clash in Lagos

THERE was pandemonium Wednesday night as five people were shot dead while many others were in-

while many others were in-jured during a clash involv-ing fhree rival cult groups in Bariga, Lagos State.

The cult groups were planning to mark their an-nual celebration 7/7 when the fight broke out. Daily Sun gathered that one victim was in critical condition in the hospital at the time of this report. However, the the hospital at the time of this report. However, the police said only three people were killed during the cult war. It was further gathered that the battle of supremaey-started last week when each cult group announced that it was preparing for a

7/7 programme, and warned residents to remain indoors at night.

A resident, Wasiu said:
"One cult group would announce that we should remain indoors, a few minutes later, another group would come and warn that we should disregard the other one, yet another would come again to give a counter order. With the a counter order. With the announcements so far, we were able to gather that there are three different cult groups battling for control of the area.

"We were shocked yes-terday night (Wednesday) when they took their battle to a new level as they started shooting. The sporadic shooting started around

the Idi-Aba area, popularly known to be a hideout of notorious cultists, and a major base of drug dealers

"The shooting spread towards Akilo, Sungas, and inwards Olorunkemi Street in Shomolu, where innocent passersby sus-tained varying degrees of injury. We went inside our homes, but people returning from work or coming from travel had to run for We couldn't come out till early morning today, when we saw dead bodies littered on the streets. At least five people were killed. Three bodies were recovered on the streets, while others died at home. Presently, one person I know very well is in a coma in the hospital.

The way I saw him, he may not survive it, as his family is not able to deposit money as demanded by the hospital management.

"We are calling on the ommissioner of Police, Commissioner Mr Idowu Owohunwa, to come to our rescue, as the cultists have sent messages

to some areas that they would avenge the killing of their gang members, start-ing from tomorrow (today), as part of their 7/7 celebra

Oba of Benin validates court judgment on inheritance

THE Oba of Benin, Oba Ewuare II, CFR, has en-dorsed the judgement of an Edo State High court, which ordered Madam Enoghayin and Miss Otasowie Ogi-ammony to take legal and emwonyi to take legal and physical possession of late Mr. Washington Osaretin Ogiemwonyi's property, known as 7A, Upper Sakponba Road in Benin City, after granting approval for his burial rites, in accordance with Renin customs dance with Benin customs and tradition.
