3 killed in fresh attack in Plateau

...Pam, NCPC boss, condemns killing

Three people have been murdered in a fresh attack in the restive Bokkos Local Government Area of Plateau State on Friday.

The latest incident, which has raised fears of reprisal, came less than three days after more than 195 people were killed in the Christmas Eve attack in Barkin Ladi, Bokkos and Mangu local government areas of the state.

Sunday Sun gathered that the three youths had gone to check on their relatives who had apparently escaped to Bokkos town during an earlier invasion of their community when they were waylaid and killed by the gunmen at Lut village.

They were said to have been killed on the spot.

Chairman of Community Peace Observers in Bokkos LG, Kefas Mallai, confirmed the attack to newsmen in Jos on Saturday According to Mallai, "Three youths from Angwan Hausawa, Bokkos town were killed yesterday (Friday) at Lut, one of the communities earlier attacked by assailants on Christmas Eve."

He identified them as Lurwan Ismail, a Muslim from Ron Kulere, Muhammadu Tuka (Ron Muslim), and Mayo (Mwaghavul Christian),

"They went there to pick up their loved ones who escaped to Bokkos town as IDPs when they were killed.

He said their bodies had not been retrieved by their relatives.

The recent attack, added to the growing anxiety following the attack and harvest of deaths in the three local government areas.

Fear of reprisal had led to cancellation of Fulani festival by the Wase Emirate Council and the New Year visit to the Gbong Gwom Jos by Jos Joint Traditional Council.

The Plateau States Police Public Relations Officer, Alfred Alabo, and his counterpart in the Operation Safe Haven OPSH, Capt Oya James, could not be reached as their phones were switched off when our correspondent tried to reach them for comments.

Meanwhile the Executive Secretary of the Nigerian Christian Pilgrim Commission (NCPC), Rev. Dr. Yakubu lamented the gruesome killings of innocent persons on Christmas Eve in Bokkos.

Rev Pam who was at the Plateau State Government House, Rayfield, to console with Governor Caleb Mutfwang over the December 24, 2023 butchering said he was pained and devastated hearing the news of the dastardly act.

In a statement signed by his Media Officer, Pam Ayuba, the NCPC executive secretary said he was away in Rome for state-of-thereadiness preparations for next year's Christian pilgrimage when he learnt of the incident, while condemning the perpetrators of the heinous crime.

He said the Plateau killings must be stopped because since 2001 when the crisis erupted, it had not subsided. Rather, previous governments had continued to witness its resurgence unabated, a situation he lamented would negatively continue to hunt children born at that time, leaving them with the impression of a deep-rooted hate for one another if there was no solution to the carnage.

Pam praised President Bola Ahmed Tinubu for his prompt response by sending a high-powered Federal Government delegation led by the Vice President, Senator Kashim Shettima who consoled with families of the bereaved and the Plateau State government over the massacres.

He sued for peace and unity amongst the people, especially the communities to heed security alerts and not take their safety for granted.

Rev Pam called on the security agencies to sit up and not be caught off guard as they needed to wake up to arrest the criminals as directed by Mr President.

He told Governor Mutfwang that he was under the instructions of Mr President to initiate a peace dialogue that would draw a new roadmap for peace in the state promising to engage the people in a peace dialogue.

Responding, Governor Mutfwang appreciated the NCPC boss for his show of love, admitting that it's a trying time for the government.

The governor who spoke through the Secretary to the Government of the State, Arc Sam Jatau, said the attack was highly coordinated, organised, and carried out by the terrorists in 20 communities simultaneously.

The governor recounted that more than 10 times, the attacks had taken place since 2001, but promised to take a new approach. He said self-defense was not an offence under any law, restating the commitment of his administration to tackling the social menace.

He said Plateau is more united than ever as most cultural activities lined up by the different ethnic groups in the state for the New Year had been put off in solidarity with the affected people, affirming that an injury to one is an injury to all.

He described the attack as heinous, and said the government was very proactive, and praised the VP for is efforts.

The governor praised the executive secretary, stating that the state was proud of having him as he hoped that this would be the end of the killings.

A similar visit was paid to the traditional ruler of Bokkos, Saf Lawrence Ishak, and his district heads where Rev Pam sued for peace and forgiveness. He addressed the victims at Bokkos Church of Christ In Nations (COCIN) Central Church Compound, praying for them to be strong and remain focused on God.
