Police on Manhunt for Robbers with Bullet Wounds

The Police in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) Command have appealed to residents to look out for two robbers with serious bullet wounds as they are potentially dangerous and are on the run having been shot in a shoot out with Police last weekend.

Public Relations Officer, FCT Command, Elisha Atikinkpan stated that following a distress call that Plot 21 Road 22, Gwarimpa Estate that armed robbers were operating in the area, two teams of Policemen drafted to the area succeeded in tracking the robbers to Area 1 Garki, but the robbers started shooting at the police.

"The armed robbers

drove to Area 1 (Garki) roundabout and on sighting the Police made a U-turn. The Police gave them a hot chase but around Church Village (Garki) they engaged the Police in a shoot out and their vehicle somersaulted as a result."

According to the PPRO, one of the robbers died at the accident spot before he could be given medical attention even as others escaped with bullet wounds. The deceased suspect on being searched was found to be in possession of a University of Abuja (Computer Science Department) identity card bearing the name Utobong Umotofik.

Other items found on the

deceased include a locally made revolver pistol with three rounds of live ammunitions and two mobile phones.

Unfortunately for one of the fleeing suspects, one Aliyu Mustapha, he was arrested at Apo Bridge with bullet wound though his accomplices are still on the run.

"We wish to appeal to members of the public to be on the look out for any person seen with bullet wounds and report same to the nearest Police station. We want to thank members of the public and the press for their cooperation which has contributed immensely in making Abuja a crime free area" the Police image maker said.
