
Five-year-old boy dies in Onitsha explosion ...filling station, posh cars, 10 houses burnt

five-year-old boy lost his life in Onitsha, Anambra State when a tanker caring Premium Motor Spirit (PMS) com-

monly known as fuel lost control and rammed into a filling station

Also, property and goods worth several millions of naira were destroyed in the incident.

The resultant fire burnt the tanker, the filling station, seven vehicles (among them posh cars), two tricycles and 10 houses.

The incident occurred at the DMGS area about 8:30p.m. on Wednesday.

An 80-year-old man, identified as Pa Solo, from Agulu community, Anaocha Local Government Area of Anambra State,
