o fewer than 50 persons were burnt to death in Odukpani Local Government Area of Cross River State on Friday as a petrol tanker exploded aflanding into a ditch.

The incident, which happened near the Federal Housing Authority Estate at New Netim in Odukpani, created pandemonium as people watched helplessly as the fire burnt their loved

It was learnt that the incident happend at about 3.00pm, when the driver was trying to maneuver his way round a bad por-there, over 50 started shouttion on the road when the ing as they were trapped in tanker detached from the truck head and fell into the ditch.

claimed to have witnessed the gory incident, said: "Initially, people within the axis. gathered and were siphoning the fuel. They later brought a liquid pumping generator to pump the fuel into another tanker, in that process, it backfired igniting the highly inflammable liquid inside the tanker.

"The people that were the flames. We were there, but the flames, were so intense that no body was able to go near and the ones inside couldn't run out ei-

He added: "The people mable product and it was standing outside started while this was going on that shouting and crying. One of the victims who tried to come out was later aided and dragged outside as the

fire had engulfed his whole

"The Fire Service later came, but they couldn't stop the fire because the fire was too much. About 7-8.00PM, the fire was still burning."

Sunday Telegraph also learnt that the tanker, which took off from the Calabar depot, was heading to the northern part of the state when the accident happened.

The Public Relations Officer of the state's Police Command, Ms Irene Ugbo, who confirmed the incident, said she could not put figure on the victims, adding, however, that "the Police had asked them to leave the place but they refused to heed instruction."

Meanwhile, the Cross

River Government has donated medical equipment to the emergency ward of the University of Calabar Teaching Hospital (UCTH) to aid the victims of the fuel tanker explosion.

The equipment included cartons of intravenous fluids, hand sanitizers, wound dressing equipment among others.

The state's Commissioner for Health, Dr Inyang Asibong, who donated the equipment to the hospital on Saturday, described the incident as "tragic and sud-

Asibong said that the visit to the hospital was to access the situation and donate the equipment for the treatment of the survivors.

She explained that as soon as the victims were brought

into the hospital, the ministry had to mobilise its personnel to join their colleagues in the UCTH to respond timely to the victims.

"We don't have the exact number of casualties at the moment, but I know that we have lost a dozen of them due to the explosion.

'People must stop the act of scooping fuel whenever a tanker falls in their area. Many persons have died in the past through this.

"We will do everything possible as a state to make sure that we don't lose these ones," she said.

Prof. Thomas Agan, the Chief Medical Director of UCTH, told NAN in an interview that 18 pers were brought into the h pital on Friday night.

Agan explained that of the 18 victims, 15 w adults while three w children, adding that victim died on arri while another one d later at night.

"As we speak, we ha 16 victims in our facil 18 victims were brough for treatment and two them have died.

"The 16 victims are fai stable. We need supp from corporate bodies, dividuals and groups cause we have exhaust our internal consumable
