Several reported dead as fire guts Borno IDP Camp

Several people are feared Skilled in a fire that broke out in an Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camp in Gaiiram, Nganzai Local Government Area of Borno State.

The incident, which occurred on Thursday, claimed the lives of four people—two children and two elderly persons—according to the media officer of the Borno State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA), Mr. Ibrahim Uba.

He disclosed that no fewer

than 4,000 households were affected by the fire while the only hospital in the community was also razed down.

Uba added that a high-level delegation constituted by SEMA had visited Gajiram to assess the extent of damage and get first-hand information from those affected.

Meanwhile, a humanitarian organisation, Norwegian Refugee Council, said it gathered that eight people died and two others critically injured at the affected hospital.

In a series of tweets on Saturday, it noted that more than 10,000 homes were destroyed while about 15,000 people were displaced as a result of the inferno.

According to the organisation, the fire started as a result of a spark from a cooking stove used by a child preparing her food.

But an eye witness said that the inferno was fuelled by a whirlwind, which made it spread fast, burning down shelters in the camp.
