



Catholic knight remanded for dealing 'illegally' in heroin

Justice Daniel Osiagor of a Federal High Court in Lagos has ordered the remand of a Catholic knight, Sir Basil Okafor, and his cousin, Edwin Okwuchukwu Izuchukwu, in custody of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) over alleged illegal dealing in 2.169 kg of heroin.

The judge's order was sequel to the arraignment of the duo by the NDLEA on Centre.

In his response, defence lawyer, Benson Idakara, drew the court's attention to his clients' bail motion, saying it has been served on the prosecution. He also urged the court to remand the defendants in NDLEA's custody pending perfection of their bail conditions.
