Meanwhile, further investigation is ongoing to unravel more details about the suspects, their activities and source of firearm.

The Lagos State Commissioner of Police, CP Abiodun Alabi, once again assured residents of the state of the resolve of the Command to eradicate all forms of criminality in the state.

The spokesperson, however, said, the suspects would be arraigned at the conclusion of investigation.

alleged to have been terrorising Ede, a major town in Osun State, has been remanded in Ilesa Correctional Centre.

The police had arrested Rasheed last Saturday after three months of being declared wanted for allegedly committing various criminal offences.

Oko-ilu was arraigned yesterday afternoon on a nine-count at a Chief Magistrate Court in Osogbo, Osun State.

The charge includes conspiracy to commit felony, unlawful killings, engaging in unlawful society, illegal possession of arms among others.

Chief Magistrate, Olusegun Ayilara ordered that the suspect be remanded in Correctional custody due to the magnitude of offences allegedly committed.

A charge sheet obtained by *New Telegraph* in the court, yesterday

reads that "Rasheed 'M' and others now at large, between 13th day of February 2020 and 7th day of August 2022 at Ede, Osun State in the Ede Magisterial District, did conspire amongst yourselves to commit a felony to wit: Murder and thereby committed an offence contrary to and punishable under section 324 of the Criminal Code cap. 34 Vol.II Laws of Osun State of Nigeria, 2002.

"That you Hammed Rasheed 'M' and others now at large, on the same date, time, place and in the aforementioned Magisterial District, did unlawfully kill one Hassan Adedeji 'm' and thereby committed an offence contrary to and punishable under Section 319(1) of the Criminal Code Cap. 34 Vol.II Laws of Osun State of Nigeria 2002.
