

Oyo Police parade lover's killer, kidnapper in Ibadan

The Oyo State Police Command yesterday paraded a suspect, Joshua Oyebode (50), for allegedly killing a 22-year-old lady, Bukola Ajala, over fear of disclosure of their blood oath.

According to the Police Public Relations Officer

(PPRO), Adewale Osifeso (SP) in a release made available to New Telegraph in Ibadan yesterday, said the alleged offence was committed somewhere in Ogbomosho Town on November 19, 2022.

Noting that his boss, Mr Adebawale Williams (Commissioner of Police), has strengthened the security networks in the state to forestall perpetration of criminal acts, he warned that there is no hiding place for criminals.

Osifeso said, Oyebode was arrested following discreet intelligence gathering on the dastardly act.

According to him: "On November 20, 2022 at about 1200hrs, upon a report incidented at the Owode-Ogbomosho Divisional Police Headquarters, by one Ajala Emmanuel 'm',

that he received a call from his daughter's guardian intimating him about her demise, preliminary investigation was carried out and it revealed that on 19/11/2022 at about 1000hrs, the suspect had lured the deceased to a remote location where he strangled her to death for the fear that she might reveal details of their administered oath and sexual escapades which had been going on for a while after stumbling on her packing out her belongings."

The Command said that the suspect, "has since voluntarily confessed to the crime and would be charged to court. Updates would be provided accordingly," he said.

In another development, the Police said that they received a complaint from, "one Akinwale K. of Akobo area, Ibadan on November 22, 2022 at about 1630hrs concerning the mysterious disappearance of his daughter, Jesuferanmi, to the Command's Anti-kidnapping Squad (AKS). The unit immediately swung into action through the fusion of available intelligence and purposeful deployment of its operational asset.
