

Insecurity: Bandits kill 2, abduct 3 women, raze Sokoto community

Aggrieved communities in Illela Local Government Area of Sokoto State and its environment sharing borders with Niger Republic have expressed sadness over the nonchalant behaviour of the Human Rights Commission as it has remained silent over the terrorist attacks on some communities in the area.

This is happening as a result of fresh attack on Danbar - Dikko village in Danba Ward where attackers burnt the community

including villagers locally made food stuffs Silos and other properties worth millions of naira.

An eyewitness account revealed that the bandits killed two persons and abducted four women who, according to him, were still in the kidnappers' custody at the time he spoke to the press.

The local government Sole administrator, Hon Sahabi Wakili who confirmed the incident also blamed the human right organisation for their nonchalant attitude towards ensuring that justice prevails and curtailing the occurrence

of the incident in the area.

Hon Wakili pointed out that this was the second time the bandits have attacked the village where many people died as a result of the last attacks.

However, the community has written a petition in which they complained to the human right organisation, lawyers, police and other authorities seeking justice on the perpetrators of the attacks.

The community further alleged that the attack on the Dambar- Dikko was organised by a Fulani bandit spearheaded by the group gang leader popularly

known as Kachalla Bube.

According to them the human right organisation deliberately refused to attend to their complaint on the activities of the Kachalla Bube, who was the prime suspect in the attack on the Hausa community in the area.

"The so-called human rights organization was in the habit of responding to issues of security challenges as it relates to Bube and his cohorts".

"They seriously give the suspects legal and humanitarian support while denying such rights to the other people in the community," they Wakili further alleged.
