Suspected Stay-At-Home Enforcers Kill 2 In Aba

Hooded men in black shirts and trousers, suspected to be stay-at-home enforcers, have killed two persons in Aba, the commercial hub of Abia State.

The incident, it was learnt occurred around Old Express off Sameck junction, near a popular slaughter within the area in Aba North Local Government Area.

While one of the victims was simply identified as a caretaker of a nearby house, the other whose identity was not immediately ascertained, was left to die in the pool of his blood by the assailants.

No group has claimed responsibility for the killing, leaving residents of the area to live in fear. It was learnt that the group of boys came to the compound and were knocking on the house door, the deceased (caretaker) came out to see those knocking and was shot in front of his residence.

Residents of the state for the second day, stayed away from their business premises in adherence to the stay-at-home order by members of the Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB).
