## 3 Suspected Robbers Burnt in Imo

hree unidentified suspected robbers were Wednesday at different locations burnt to death in a renewed fight against armed robbers and phone snatchers in Imo State by angry citizens who are bent on clearing the state of harassement by hoodlums.

Most of them expressed doubts on the possibility of the planned stake-holders' meeting of the state wing of the party producing a governorship candidate without causing more disaffection and

further squabbles in the party, even as some of them described the idea as undemocratic.

Egwu, had during the sitting of the Reconciliation Committee in Abakaliki under the Chairmanship of Alhaji Maina Waziri, hinted that he would call a stakeholders' meeting to trash the issue of who becomes the party's gubernatorial flagbearer in the state, saying that only after the meeting could campaigns start.
