"The officers mistook the rob-

cers died instantly while the forth one died in an hospital" a police source stated. The hood-lums, who were said to be infiniitary and mobile police uniform at the time of the incident went away with a police official rifle and some communication equipment.

Yesterday's attack on policemen by robbers bring to the fore the state of insecurity in the State.

In less than two months there has been a total of about five bank robbers in the state, all of which recorded major casualties on the part of the police.
