# 20 Dead in Bodo-Mogho Communal Clashes

espite the movement of heavily armed mobile police and other security agencies to quell thecommimal clashes between Bodo and Mogo in Gokana Local Government area of Rivers State at least 20 persons were killed before the police brought the situation under control while some people that escaped the problem from Mogho claimed that their community has been totally razed down

However, the arrival of the policemen is said to have abated the clashes which resulted over the dispute of ownership of a large expanse of land though some other interests which people allege were political have been blamed for the problem.

Though the problem is said to have been brought under control, some ppeople who escaped from the area said that there were many dead bodies yet to be picked up while some people as at yesterday were still looking for their relatives. Those that ventured into the battle areas said that Mogho has been deserted with even their local chief in flight.

A man who claimed to have escaped by whiskers from his

assailiants from the area said under condition of anonymity that "now virtually all the surrounding communities, except Bodo, are hosting people that have fled Mogho. You know, not everybody has a relative or friend to go and stay with in Port Harcourt and the number of those who have stayed in nearby communities is higher than those who went as far as Port Harcourt to seek refuge. So the situation we are currently faced with is that of refugee situation; their health and other conditions".
