# Killing of Cops, Not Deliberate — Taskforce

ne Nigerian Army yesterday admitted that its men were the ones that fired and killed the four policemen at Ogbakiri, Emuoha Local Government area of Rivers State on Tuesday morning.

They however said that the killing was not deliberate but was an error, which occurred, in controversial circumstances, which further investigations may yet reveal the full details of what actually led to the error.

Admitting the facts of the killing of the policemen, the Army Public Relations Officer in Rivers State, who also speaks for the Joint Task Force, Major Musa Segir said there was no way any man in the army would deliberately kill a policeman or anybody at all.

"No Nigerian army or soldier will deliberately kill any policeman. Everybody in the state now knows that the JTF is in operation at Ogbakiri. Those deployed were on regular patrol. They met four plain clothes human beings; the vehicle they were using was not marked.

On approaching them, they corked their riffles, some even fired. Our men fired back and later took their riffles to the Police Headquarters", Major Segir confirmed.

It was at the Police Headquarters that it was confirmed that the men involved were policemen duly deployed to the State. However, the Police Public Relations Officer, Mrs. Ireju Barasua said their men were shot at about 11am when they went to confront armed robbers.

According to her, by the time their men were at the robbery scene, the robbers had left, prompting them to embark on a patrol of the East-West road where at a point their vehicle developed a fault and while trying to fix it, were fired at and killed by men in army uniform

Another source involved in the operation said that the incident happened at about 3am contrary to the claim by the police that it was about 11am, adding that there was no armed robbery in the area at the time of the incident

## Fire Victims Get Mass Burial

he about 90 people who were burnt to death in Kagark Local Government Area of Kaduna State were buried in a mass grave yesterday. The victims were burnt to death in a fire incident caused by a 33,000 litre petrol tanker that lost control and tipped over at a bend, about 45 kilometres from Jere.

There were fears that even about 20 others who sustained serious injuries and were receiv-
