ASP N-Nnudam Frederick. denied knowledge of mass arrest and killing of 15 persons, stating that "no sane person will go to Onicha and begin to shoot sporadically at people." He said he was yet to get full details of the protest by the women from his investigation department.

The women claimed that the mass arrest by the police was as a result of the killing of two of their men, DSP Wilfred Ekpe and Sergeant Ekpenyong Effium by the youth, who were protesting alleged government insensitivity to their plight.

The demonstrators, among them widows and pregnant women took their protest to the Abakaliki Government House, where they resisted attempts by the police to drive them away at the gate.

Most of the women sustained grievous injuries, while about four of them appeared almost naked, in a move aimed at attracting attention.
