

Robbers Raid Police Station, Kill 2

Dare-devil armed bandits went on rampage yesterday in Lagos raiding the Morogbo Police Station on Badagry Expressway.

Two yet to be identified persons were feared dead while several others including policemen attached to the Station sustained various degrees of

injuries. The robbers had allegedly trailed some Igbo business men who were returning from the neighbouring Republic of Benin with about N45m cash. They actually sought refuge at the station when they discovered that they

were been closely followed by some group.

The attack at the Station which almost threw the entire Command off guard was later brought under control as Anti-Riot Policemen attached to Agbara police Station and Badagry were immediately drafted to the scene.

The attack at the Station came even as the Lagos State Police Commissioner yesterday said he will deal ruthlessly with any commercial motorcyclist arrested while operating in the metropolis by 10pm.

He revealed that over 80 percent of the crime committed in the State were allegedly carried out by motorcyclists popularly referred to as okada riders.

Though details of the attack at Morogbo Police station was still sketchy as at the time this report was filed but an impeccable police source at the Command Headquarters, Ikeja told THISDAY that the robbers had allegedly trailed some Igbo traders from the neighbouring Republic of Benin where they had already gone to do business.
