

## Nigeria: Killings - Fishing Trawlers' Workers Petition Yar'Adua

Comment on this article Thousands of fishing trawlers workers under the aegis of the Fishing Trawlers Workers

Association yesterday stormed the office of the Governor of Lagos state, Babatunde Fashola to protest the massive killing of their colleagues by sea pirates on the country's waterways.

They have therefore called on President Umaru Yar'Adua to wade into the matter and stop the killing. The placard carrying members of the association in Lagos, who appeared in black t-shirts with hearse and casket distrupted free flow of traffic for over one hour along the Governor's road said the country's territorial water was no longer safe.

The President of the association, Captain Shehu Kosoko who spoke on behalf of the protesters declared that sea pirates have infested the country's territorial waters like lotus, adding that the activities of the sea pirates' attack has stopped fishing operations. He explained that within the last two weeks, the industry has suffered almost 50 attacks on theirvessels while 10 sailors have lost their lives in the last 10 days.

In a Save our Soul (SOS) letter sent to the President, via Governor Babatunde Fashola and signed by Kosoko and the General Secretary, Captain Isaac Esiekpe, the Association maintained that the sea has become a haven for nefarious acts of brutality by sea pirates, with fishing trawlers crew falling prey everyday from Lagos to Rio in Cameroon border of Cross Rivers State. It maintained that their fishing trawlers operators could no longer carry out their legitimate business with ease in the face of indiscriminate shootings and killings.

According to the group, "These uncontrolled activitiesofsea pirates and hijackers had necessitated thecaptains of all fishing trawlers in the country to to withdraw all trawlers from the country's territorialwaters for the fear of their lives and other crews onboard." It declared that more than 57 ship captains, andsailors have been killed within the period of twoyears by the said criminals, appealing to the governmentto liaise with all relevant security agencies with aview to taking necessary actions to clear the sea ofthe menace. Receiving the letter on behalf of the Governor, the state Deputy Governor, Mrs. Sarah Sosan











assured theprotesters that their message would be given theattention it required, noting that the message wouldbe treated with utmost dispatch to the presidency. Sosan further assured them that all hands would be ondeck to save the situation, commiserating with thefamilies of those who lost their lives among thegroup. "We can't allow this to continue.

We have a duty toprotect you as good citizens and I can assure thatwhen the Governor comes back, he would pass yourmessage to Mr. President. "Your job is also a source of foreign exchange incometo the nation, we can't afford to loose you people. I assure you that the president will act, like you knowhe is a listening president", she said.
