of fewer than two persons were allegedly shot dead yesterday as security swooped on the members of the Movement for the Actualisation of the Sovereign State of Biafra (MASSOB), who were celebrating Biafra Day at Aba.

Leaders of the organisation, who addressed newsmen at Umuahia during a rally attended by hundreds of Massobians, said that the dead were among those shot by the police while several others were arrested

But the Abia State Police Command could not confirm the clash as the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Mr. Ali Okechukwu, told THISDAY in a telephone chat that the report of the alleged shooting and arrests were yet to reach his desk.

MASSOB's Director of

Security, Umuahia region, Mr. Kingsley Chetachi, told newsmen that the security agencies had no moral justification to use arms on people engaging in non-violent protests, adding that the police have been hounding MASSOB members over the past two weeks.

"But irrespective of what they are doing to us

we are not deterred as we will continue to agitate for Biafra non-violently," Chetachi said.

MASSOB's Regional Administrator for Umuahia, Comfort Ogbuokiri, called on the United Nations (UN) to intervene in the Biafra issue to save *Ndigbo* from being victimised in the country, adding that Biafran independence was long over due.
