Reports from the creeks have it that the war between Igodo and Ateke Tom, whose soldiers have successfully routed about eight smaller militia groups in the creeks of Southern Ijaw, an area which is well noted for guerilla warfare, started when Igodo refused the Ateke Tom's men passage

through his territory.

The refusal soon degenerated into a battle, at the end of

which Igodo's camp was

destroyed. A wounded Igodo who was shot on both legs was spirited away by his soldiers. Unconfirmed reports said he died in the early hours of yes-

terday, at the Ekeowe Cmmunity Cottage Hospital, where he was rushed for treatment.

Also both bodies called for the inclusion of the independent candidate clause in the constitution amendment being embarked upon by the National

Assembly.

Specifically, the women group called for the scrapping of the Federal Character Commission and its replace-

ment with what it described as an Equal Opportunity Board Several other independent papers also called for the return of the two-party system, which was introduced by the regime of former military preident, include the Political Parties

Commission and the Electoral Offences Commission.

According to the CAN President, the political parties commission shall be responsible for monitoring of political parties and ensuring that internal democracy is built in the affairs of the political parties,
