Nigeria: Soldiers, Militants Clash in Delta

Omon-Julius Onabu With Agency Reports

Warri — Militants and the Joint military Task Force in the Niger Delta (JTF) yesterday clashed in the swamps of the southern Niger Delta region.

This is coming just as unknown gunmen Tuesday kidnapped a project engineer with a construction firm, Mr. Okoh, in Warri, Delta

The gunmen reportedly traced the victim to his residence in the Ekpan area of Effurun, near Warri and whisked him away to an unknown destination in an Infinity SUV car.

JTF spokesman, Col. Rabe Abubakar, who confirmed the kidnap, appealed to people with useful information on the incident to come forward, as all the security agencies had spread their dragnets in an attempt to rescue the victim and bring the criminals to book. He advised members of the public not to panic at the latest

development.

"The whereabouts of the kidnapped person is yet to be known, so also the motive for the kidnap", he noted, but added that the demand for ransom by the abductors could not be ruled out.

In the clash with the JTF, the militants claimed to have repelled an attack by the JTF and killed several troops in a "bloody battle".

Abubakar said the army had been ambushed, but had lost no troops.

A spokesman for the main militant group - the Movement for the Emancipation of the Niger Delta (MEND) - warned of an "impending civil war" in response.

Militant groups say they are fighting for a better

deal from Nigeria's oil, but some have been accused of operating like criminal gangs.

MEND spokesman Jomo Gbomo said the militants quickly retaliated the attack.

"Two gunboats belonging to the army have already been sunk by mines with several casualties on the side of the army," he said in an email to journalists.

The militants said in an online message yesterday that it had placed all its affiliate militants on red alert in anticipation of extensive attacks by the JTF, warning oil companies that their workers may become targets of reprisal attacks by the militants.

According to MEND: "All freedom fighters in the Niger Delta have been placed

"Oil companies operating in the region are advised to evacuate their staff within the next 24 hours to avoid them being part of the statistics of an emerging civil war," the statement further said.

But Abubakar said the MEND statement was "pure propaganda".

The JTF spokesman insisted that the militants were the aggressors, having allegedly laid an ambush for the security operatives in the creeks vesterday.

Abubakar said: "Despite intensified efforts by the Joint Task Force (JTF) code-named 'Operation Restore Hope' and other security agencies to safeguard the Niger Delta region, for socioeconomic activities to strive, some miscreants who are hell-bent on frustrating this noble objective have resorted to kidnapping, a practice which has become a source of livelihood and a gimmick used by them to scare away prospective investors and portray the oil-rich region as unsafe."

MEND is still holding British hostage Matthew Maguire who was seized from an oil services boat in September last year.

His colleague Robin Hughes was freed in April.

Militant groups in the Niger Delta operate under a cloak of poor governance and a failure in the rule of law.

They fund their activities with oil theft, extortion and kidnapping.
