Missing Oil Workers Found Dead

wo workers of National Petroleum Development Company, (NPDC), Benin City, Edo State, Danjuma Bashir and Malabu Ahmad, missing since March 13, have been found dead in a bush in Monsogar area of Delta State.

The bodies were found on Saturday morning, by a joint search team of police, State Security Service and workers, put in place by Edo State government. The workers were said to have left Benin for Delta State University, Abraka, but never got there.

However, Petroleum and Natural Gas Senior Staff Association. (PENGASSAN) has described the deaths as not only shocking, but a renewed act of criminality against oil workers that would not be tolerated.

He said, "we condemn this dastardly act and killing of our members and call on security agencies to fish out those behind this heinous crime. We are worried over the increasing insecurity of workers, especially oil workers and other innocent Nigerians. We call on government at all levels to find urgent solution to this insecurity. We can no longer tolerate this act of criminality on our members and indeed Nigerian workers."
