man was shot dead beside his bicycle, while two others were seriously injured and are receiving treatment in the hospital.

Handing over the suspect to the State Command of the Nigerian Police Force in Jos for further investigations, Okeocha said "the suspects came to the village at about 8: 30 pm on Monday and shot two who are already receiving treatment at the Air Force Hospital.

"As at the time the men of the STF arrived the scene it discovered an unidentified corpse lying by a Bicycle beside the road three Km away from the Village".

According to him, "at the same point, a Toyota was seen carrying nineteen youths of Gohon village also in Vom, with (weapons) including two locally made Revolvers, two swords, two machetes, one dagger and other dangerous items", adding that cash of N3,325 and handsets were also recovered from

them.
