LAWMA Staff Crushed to Death

n unidentified female street sweeper working with the Lagos State Waste Management Agency (LAWMA) was crushed to death yesterday at Ojota by a lony fleeing from Lagos State Traffic Management Agency (LASTMA) officials.

This came on a day the Senior Special Assistant (SSA) to Lagos State Governor Babatunde Fashola on Media, Alhaji Hakeem Bello, narrowly escaped death in a multiple auto accident involving the governor's convoy.

THISDAY investigations revealed that the driver of the lorry was stopped by LATSMA officials for violating traffic rules and during the ensuing scuffle, he tried to escape, thus hitting pedestrians in the process. The lorry, eye witnesses said, violated traffic rules by plying the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) lane at the Ojota area of the state and efforts to stop him, proved fatal for all concerned.

Confirming the accident which caused heavy traffic from Olosa to Mushin bus stop, Bello said, "I was on phone when I heard the sudden noise and what I saw was my car damaged."
