

# Lagos: 2 Killed as Fire Guts Company

• *Police probe UNILAG's killing, arrest LATSMA official over street sweeper's death*

Two persons were burnt to death while 10 others were injured in a fire that completely burnt a company, MINL, in the Ilasamaja area of Lagos yesterday morning.

THISDAY learnt that the fire destroyed equipment and goods valued at millions of naira.

Lagos State Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Mr. Samuel Jinadu, while confirming the incident, told THISDAY that two persons died, while 10 persons sustained injuries, disclosing that those injured were receiving treatment at an undisclosed hospital.

The fire incident came as the Police commenced investigation into Monday's killing

of two students at the University of Lagos, Akoka by unknown gun men. Management of the university claimed the attack was cult-induced, urging members of the academic community to be vigilant as well as make useful information available for

investigation.
