3 Policemen, 2 Others Killed in Lagos, PH

their victims. The incident occurred at about 11:20 in the morning when the robbers using a white Jetta car attacked one Salihu Sani and Abdul-Mumini Isiaka along Aba Road. The duo were said to have

been robbed of the sum of two million naira. In the process one of them was said to have lost his life, while the other has been

hospitalised. According police to spokesperson in Rivers state.


