

# Mob Kills 2 Suspected Boko Haram Members

The people of Maiduguri may have started sending out the message that they are tired of the onslaught of members of Boko Haram town, as a mob, yesterday, attacked two gunmen believed to be members of the group, killing two.

THISDAY gathered that the two men had gone to a tea joint at the Zannari Ward of Maiduguri Metropolis, seeking their targets, but were resisted and killed by the people of the area at about 8p.m.

Sources said as one of the gunmen removed his AK-47 from under his flowing gown, one of the youths in the area grabbed him from behind and subsequently disarmed and arrested him.

Seeing that his colleague had been captured, the other gunman tried to flee but was also caught by the crowd that had gathered. Some people in the crowd, according to the source, shot the two gunmen with the seized gun.

Zanari, has been one of the most volatile area in Maiduguri, as only about two months ago, there was a clash between members of the Joint Task Force (JTF) and the sect following a bomb explosion.

In another development, suspected armed robbers attacked a vehicle conveying the September salary of workers of Kaga Local Government Area of Borno State, carting away about N20 million.

It was gathered that the cashier of the council, Mallam Wakil Ali, was killed, while the police escort was injured.

THISDAY learnt the incident occurred at about 1 p.m. along Maiduguri -Damaturu road where the gunmen were believed to have trailed them from a bank in Maiduguri and caught up with the vehicle some kilometres from the town and started shooting.

After the money was taken, the robbers shot sporadically into

the air, before fleeing the scene of the incident, leaving the cashier in the pool of his blood.

It was learnt that the wounded policeman was subsequently rushed to an undisclosed hospital for treatment.

## PDP Asks CP

The Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) yesterday advised the Congress for Progressive Change (CPC) to apologise to members of the Presidential Election Petitions Tribunal for issuing a statement which members of the tribunal found offensive.

National Publicity Secretary of the PDP, Prof. Rufai Alkali, gave the advice yesterday at the headquarters of the Court of Appeal, where the tribunal was sitting.
