Mohammed further stated that the decomposing remains of the security guard was recovered on October 8.

One of the paraded suspects, Suleiman Sama'ila (24), who claimed to be an indigene of Katsina State, confessed to newsmen that he was the one that personally stabbed the deceased three times in the chest.

"After he died, we dumped

his body in the nearby river but the soldiers trailed and arrested me few minutes after the incident," he further confessed.

Yusuf Ishaku (22), Yahaya Abubakar (22) and Isiaka Abubakar, also confessed to ing the security guard was killed when he tried to thwart their effort at stealing some iron rods.
