A 24-year old student, Clifford Comuenyen, of Kado Estate, Abuja, has appeared before an Abuja Chief Magistrates' Court for allegedly causing the death of a pedestrian. The accused was charged with causing death through reckless and dangerous driving contrary to Section 27 of the Road Traffic Act. The prosecutor, Insp. Christopher Roko, said Comuenyen drove a Golf car with registration number LAGOS VE 840 KJA in a dangerous manner and knocked down the pedestrian on the Shehu Shagari highway, Abuja. Roko said the pedestrian who died while receiving treatment at the Maitama General Hospital had not yet been identified. The accused, however, pleaded not guilty. Following his plea, the prosecutor applied for adjournment to enable the police to carry out detailed investigation into the matter and to bring witnesses to court. Roko however, told the court that he had no objection to granting the accused bail, saying that bail was solely at the discretion of the court. Chief Magistrate Okeagu Azubike granted the accused bail in the sum of N500,000 with two sureties in like sum. He ordered that the sureties must be responsible Nigerians with permanent addresses and must reside within the jurisdiction of the court. The case was adjourned to February 2, 2012.
