Why we invited soldiers to Onitsha — Gov Obi

A BUJA— GOVERNIOR Peter Obi of Anambra says his invitation to the army to help quell the riots in Onitsha is to stop gangsters from causing pandemonium and mayhem.

He gave the explanation in an interview with newsmen in Abuja yesterday soon after he called on NAFDAC's Director-Gene al, Prof. Dora Akunyili.

Obi came to consult with NA DAC on the problems at the C itsha drugs market, which NA DAC had threatened to sh down for selling fake and ad terated drugs.

He said there was the need involve the police and the m tary in a joint security operation rather than allow ethnic mili rascals and touts to hold citiz to ransom.

Obi confirmed that "ab five or six persons died" d ing the fracas between the lice and persons said to bel to MASSOB and NARTO.

He said he had visited the burnt police stations to assess

the extent of damage incurred.
"Our security situation is not unique. We have neighbours like Delta, Enugu and Imo states, where the police carry

out joint operations with the

military," the governor said. He said: "In Onitsha, it is not that the security situation is getting out control, it is that this initiative, the planned joint patrol, can help what we plan to do."
